How To Enroll:

Students may enroll in the Adult School Office for all classes and by mail or online for some classes. All registration and supply fees must be paid at the time of registration. Advanced enrollment by mail or website is advised. Enrollment in some classes is limited. We are implementing a managed enrollment system this year. Students may register for a class until the class is full. Once full, we will close the class to new students. Regular attendance is expected of all students. If space is available at the quarter, new students may enroll. We will maintain a waiting list for all full classes. Attendance the first day of class is mandatory. Those who do not attend will be dropped and students for the waiting list will be allowed to enroll in the class. Regular attendance is expected of all students.

Admission: Anyone 18 years of age or older may attend. Those under 18 may be admitted by special permission when enrolled in a high school.

Cancellation of Classes:

The administration reserves the right to cancel a class if an insufficient number of students enroll or if the average attendance falls below the number required by the Redlands Unified School District.

Registration Fee:

A \$25.00 registration fee will be charged for classes where no additional fee is charged. The registration fee is included in all fee based classes. Once paid, the fee is good for the entire 2009-10 school year. Students who are dropped for non attendance will be assessed the registration fee when they re-enroll.

Return Check Fee: A \$25.00 collection fee is charged by the Redlands Adult School.

Job Training and Certificates:

Certificates of competence are issued in vocational courses when successful course work is completed.

Books and Materials:

Unless otherwise specified, students will be expected to provide their own books and materials. Books are available for sale in the office.

Uniform Complaint Procedures:

Redlands Unified School District policy provides a procedure to resolve public complaints (BP 1312.3). A copy is posted in the Adult School office.

Student Body Membership:

Persons enrolling in Redlands Adult School are invited to pay a voluntary student body fee of \$1.00 per semester. All registered students are encouraged to join and serve on the Student Council.

Refund Policy: There will be NO refunds after a class starts. If you withdraw from a class before the first meeting date, a refund fee will be charged as follows:

You may be close to a high school diploma! Redlands Adult School offers a high school diploma program called PRIDE where you can attend class and earn the credits you need for a high school diploma. The GED test and GED preparation classes are also offered. To help you make the decision about entering this program we suggest you follow these steps:

- Request your official transcript from the last school you attended.
- Take the PLACEMENT TEST for entry into the program. We offer it on: **Monday –Thursday 10:00 AM –12:00 PM AND 4:00—6:00 PM**
- Call our office at 748-6930 to schedule an appointment with our counselor. See counselor schedule on inside cover.
- After your counseling appointment you can register for classes that meet morning, afternoon or evening.
- Upon completion of your credits you will receive a transcript showing that you are a graduate of Redlands Adult School. You will receive your diploma at the graduation ceremony in June.
- We are fully accredited through the **Western Association of Schools and Colleges**.

200 credits in addition to passing scores on both sections of the California High School Exit Exam are needed to graduate from Redlands Adult School. The following classes are offered for high school credit: English 1-4, English Composition, Reading, English Electives, Math (Basic, Intermediate, Advanced, Consumer Math, Pre-Algebra, Algebra 1, Geometry, Math Electives), Life Science, Physical Science, Earth Science, Science Electives, US History, US Government, Economics, World History, Social Studies Electives, Fine Art, Art History, Art Appreciation, Drawing, Visual and Performing Arts Elective and GED Test Preparation.

ATTENTION Potential High School Graduates!

The state of California has added another requirement for obtaining your high school diploma. All students must pass the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE) in addition to the required credits to obtain their high school diploma.

GED® Test

(General Education Development Test)

Get the equivalency to a high school diploma by passing the GED test. You are tested in five areas:

- Language Arts: Writing
- Social Studies
- Science
- Language Arts: Reading
- Mathematics

Fees: **\$150 for entire test battery** including the GED certificate. Cash, charge or money order accepted for payment. **Prior registration in the Adult School office is required. Bring an official picture ID. Allow 30-40 minutes for registration. You must be at least 18 years old to take the GED test in California. Call the office for information about under 18 testing. Retests are \$35 each. Call the office for re-test dates.**

Students who score low on the entry assessment will need to attend our Accelerated Reading class to help improve reading speed and comprehension. (see below)

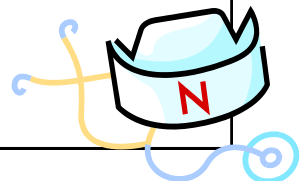

Any person who believes that the District's nondiscrimination and/or sexual harassment policy has been violated may file a complaint with the school principal/site administrator, or utilize the District's Uniform Complaint Procedures.

Student Records: Pursuant to the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, the Adult School is required to inform you of your rights regarding school records, and data related to you.

Firearms, Weapons, Alcohol, Drugs: Firearms are not permitted on campus, even with a permit, unless you are a duly sworn peace officer or have written permission of the principal.

School's Right to Know Student & Visitor Identity Policy: (For Protection of Student's, Staff, Visitors, and their Personal Property). Students and Visitors are required to give their name and reason for being on campus to an identified Adult School staff member or Campus Security Officer.

Smoking is Prohibited: As of July 1, 1995, State Law and District Policy prohibits smoking in any place on campus or in vehicles on campus for faculty, staff, and students.

Visitor/Student Conduct & Responsibilities: All visitors and Adult School students are expected to conduct themselves in such a manner as to contribute to a productive educational environment.

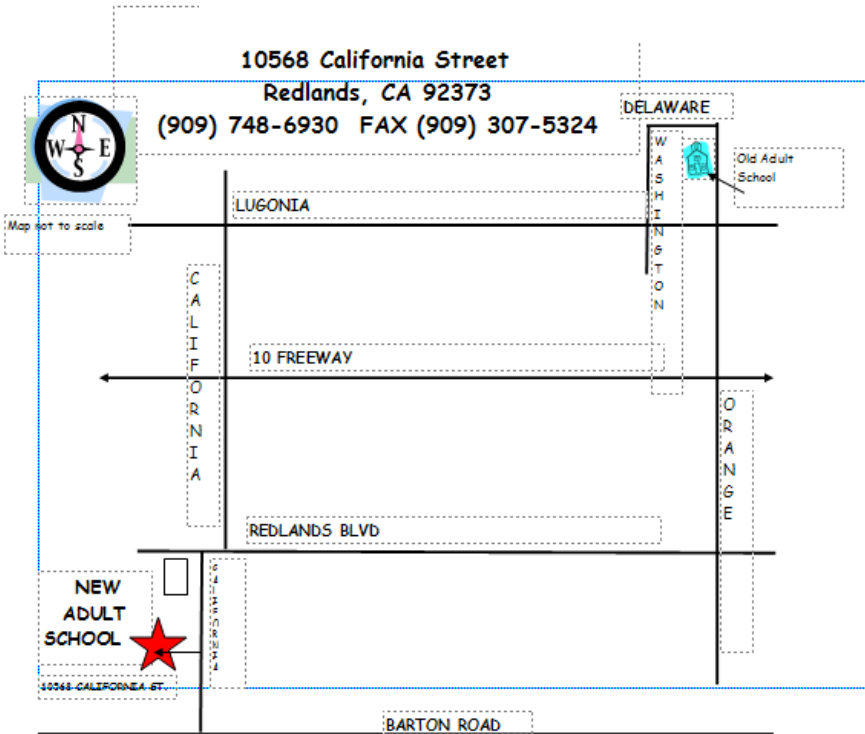
